- The Ohio State University is a leading doctoral degree granting institution in the United States. Between 1998 and 2002, Ohio State ranked 8th in the nation in doctoral degrees granted (3,074). For the same period, Ohio State was ranked 4th in the nation in granting doctoral degrees to African American students (135).
- The Graduate School at Ohio State is comprised of university faculty authorized to give graduate instruction (the Graduate Faculty), an elected legislative body (Council on Research and Graduate Studies), and the Graduate School office.
- Ohio State has 110 graduate programs, offering 122 degrees (Master's and Doctoral) ranging from accounting to women's studies.
- Ohio State makes it easy to enhance your graduate degree with a dual or combined program, formal graduate minor, or interdisciplinary specialization.
- Ohio State attracts students from all around the world. Representing 28 percent of the total graduate student population and representing 106 countries, 2,771 international students enrolled in the Graduate School in Autumn Quarter 2002.
- Ohio State offers financial support to high quality graduate students from diverse backgrounds. In Autumn Quarter 2002, 54 percent of graduate students received fellowships or graduate research, teaching, or administrative associateships.
- Ohio State has a vast infrastructure to support graduate education and research at the highest level. During the 2002-03 academic year, 2,894 graduate faculty taught and advised graduate students. In Fiscal Year 2003, Ohio State faculty and students won 2,929 externally funded research grants and contracts for a total of \$320 million.
- Rules, policies, and guidelines relating to graduate education are established by the Council on Research and Graduate Studies, the legislative body governing graduate programs at Ohio State. Members of the Council include elected graduate faculty and graduate students. The Dean of the Graduate School chairs the Council.
